- Continued development of a story map to highlight agriculture and forestry activities in Auburn. More than 150 points have been logged with photos of cropland, pasture, orchards, community gardens etc. This project will continue in 2023.

- Hosted Matt Manson (Blackie's) and Chris Peircy (Auburn Schools Nutrition Director) for discussion of work being done to get more local produce into school lunch programs.

- Hosted DACF representatives Flanagan and Pfaeler for update on State research and evaluation of PFAS contamination.
- Hosted Lynn Holland for presentation and discussion concerning invasive Amythas "Crazy" worms in Maine, including Auburn.
- Hosted Julia Harper, Good Food Council of Lewiston-Auburn for discussion of model city ordinances to support farm stands, farmers markets, animals etc. as well as a GFC survey conducted in L-A showing interest in composting, canning, hoop greenhouses, fruit trees and honey bees.
