## Committee Conversation:

Committee started to discuss the 10 Acre rule. Committee would like to recommend that lots established as of 1.1.18 with 3+ acres will become buildable lots. They must meet the income guidelines set forward by these changes and must be farming to have a dwelling. Lots in access of 20+ acres can be split after 5 years of this adoption and once every 5 years thereafter with the approval of the Agricultural Commission (if formed, name to be determine). No new lots under 10 acres to be made.

Motion to accept this by Holly Lasagna, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Alfredia Fournier - 6 approved 2 Opposed

## **OPEN CONVERSATION:**

Barbara Keene – North River Road, believes that this is unfair to the ones who have owned the land before this new amendment. Wants to make sure the committee really thinks about this because she doesn't want the committee to regret their decision in 30-50 years.

Michelle Malaragno – Trapp Road, is concerned with the increase in buildable lots/development that taxes and such will go up forcing larger tract farms to have to split and sell off some land.

Leroy Walker – talked about not changing taxes for farmers. Keeping the tax rate where it is for those that are farming.
