- Federally funded
- · Can get demonstration, planning, and construction funds
- o Over-Burdened and Underserved Communities are looked for in funding
- Action plan has leadership commitment, safety analysis, planning, engagement
- o Action plan has equity, policy, strategy, transparency considerations
- Each community can have a plan from this process that can be adopted
- Step to identify needs for a formal plan
- o Process will focus on high-risk locations, seek high-level adoption
- o Can seek demonstration grant funds planters, striping, flex posts

- Bob mentioned "process fatigue" issue real concern with future work and outcomes coming from this effort
- Consultant team is currently listening to the community seeking input on high concern areas/issues
- CS Members can reach out and invite those from the community
- Outreach to stakeholders school district, community makers (Craig Saddlemire)
- o Consultants looking for crash data for high injury network for area
- What system can be used for surveys/outreach?
- o Bates short-term work might be of value
- Look at feedback items for engaging public
- Can't just be about crashes people avoid dangerous places
- Will MaineDOT be supportive of outcomes? Jason feels pretty strongly that safety outcomes can be supported by MaineDOT
- o Will be important to look at planning processes around "near miss" areas
- o Looking at St. Mary's, YMCA, Auburn Housing, CDBG Advisory Groups, etc. for outreach
- o Cities will take lead on outcome with input from consultants
- Cities want policy makers to show up at workshops to hear what constituents have to say
