Constituent work: I've received a number of emails and phone calls relating to trash on our streets such as furniture and mattresses left at the curb for weeks. It is a great community school with outstanding results- Auburn's only Grade A school. The Community Development department is expected to hold a citizen input session to develop a neighborhood revitalization strategy for the Downtown, New Auburn and Union Street areas. Much of the strategy will be drawn from work the City has already completed, but the City would also like ideas and input from its citizens. Be watching for specific dates.
