Auburn Public Library

- We have started opening our Teen Space for tweens on early release Wednesdays. Tweens are welcome to visit between noon and 2 p.m.

Fire

- Auburn Fire personnel worked with Safety Works inspectors on Tuesday 9/9/14 to determine department compliance with BLS regulations.
- Crews also prepared Central Station for the 9/11 Memorial Service and Red Cross Blood Drive to take place on September 11th from 8-10 AM & 1-6 PM.
- > The ramp up for fire prevention month continues.
- FPO O'Connell conducted compliance assistance with the re-opening of the Head Start on Valerie Circle which was damaged during their fire on 9/3/14.
- Certificate of Occupancy was granted to "The Granite Group", which opened in the old Wonder Bread outlet store on Minot Avenue.
- FPO O'Connell investigated the structure fire which occurred at 340 Court Street on 9/7/14.
- For the week of September 4th to September 10th, we responded to 61 calls for service. These include, but are not limited to: 2 fire alarm calls, 3 fire calls including 1 second alarm structure fire. 44 Emergency Medical calls, 5 Motor Vehicle Accidents, 2 Natural Gas Leaks and 5 service calls. We provided mutual aid to Lewiston for a structure fire and received mutual aid for the second alarm fire.

ICT

- Worked with Assessing and Patriot software support to develop a methodology for creating a 2014 Historical data archive file, which is a snapshot of the Assessing data files as of the tax commitment date. The snapshot file will be used to update both GIS and the Webpro online assessing system.
- Revised the GIS Roles section of the GIS Protocol document. The revised roles were updated to mirror recent changes to the ArcGIS Online user role assignments. The GIS Protocol document will be presented to the Steering committee for approval next week.
- Updated the Municipal phone controller software, to bring it up to the same version as the Public Safety controller. The present software version will provide some additional functionality, including the ability to build some redundancy into our voice network.
- The elevator/access control software is now fully operational, and we are able to make cards again. The next step is to begin the gradual replacement of door lock hardware.
- Set up a new user account for Dr. Ian Reight, the medical director of the ambulance service. His email address is <u>ireight@auburnmaine.gov</u>.

- > Registrations continued for Flag Football and Pee Wee Soccer.
- Youth Football practices & games (3-6th grade) continued. There are a total of 75 players and 9 volunteer coaches in this division this season. Competitors participate in the Mid Coast Youth Football League (MCYFL) which is comprised of teams from: Bath, Brunswick, Gardiner, Lewiston, and Turner. Week three of the season continues on Saturday with Auburn teams competing against opponents from Lewiston.
- Youth Football practices (7-8th grade) continued. There are a total of 39 players and 4 coaches in this division this season. Competitors participate in the Mid Coast Middle School Football League (MCMSFL) which is comprised of teams from: Bath, Brunswick, Mt. Ararat, Gardiner, Lewiston, Oxford Hills, and Turner. Players will compete in game two of their season on Saturday against opponents from Brunswick.
- Flag Football (1-2nd grade) began practices on Tuesday. In this program, players are introduced to the game of football. Participants will learn the basics of offense, defense, the line of scrimmage and other key elements of the game. Players practice twice a week and play games on Saturdays for a six-week season. There are a total of 29 players and 2 volunteer coaches in this division this season.

- Adult Softball Player's League, Middle Division playoffs concluded with the Championship game on Sunday. Main St Market faced Pepsi, with Main Street Market emerging victorious. A total of 15 teams and 240 players competed in this division this season.
- Pee Wee Soccer began on Sunday. This program is once again expertly instructed by members of the MPS Portland Phoenix Soccer Club. In this program, players are introduced to the basic techniques of soccer in a fun and positive environment. Emphasis is on learning through fun games and small-sided play. This season, a total of 65 participants are registered for the program.
- The annual resurfacing/curing process was completed on the Hasty gym floor, and was reopened for use on Monday.
- The 8th Annual Holiday Celebration/Parade of Lights planning process continued. December 3rd has been selected as the date for the event this year.
