I. <u>CALL TO ORDER/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE</u>

A. Introductions

Karen Mathieu called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Members introduced themselves, noting the ward they represent. Karen Mathieu reminded the public that this ZOOM meeting is being recorded and is available through Great Falls TV. During Public Participation people can call in with the phone number that is provided.

B. Communications

Karen Mathieu shared the School Committee's gratitude for the staff members that are out there everyday. A huge thank you to the educators.

Katy Grondin, Superintendent, shared that the Top Ten Students were revealed. This was announced at each of their homes. Top Ten Students are as follows:

Katy Grondin shared that Administrators gave a shout out to staff during teacher appreciation week for all that they are doing.

Faith Fontaine shared an email that she received from a concerned community member. The community member stated his/her disappointment in the way the School Committee is conducting themselves during the ZOOM meetings.

Karen Mathieu will invite the students to the next meeting on May 20, 2020 to give an update.

V. <u>SUPERINTENDENT REPORT</u>

Katy Grondin, Superintendent, shared that they are preparing for the budget workshop. Budget discussions will continue on May 27, 2020 at 6:00 PM.

Katy Grondin and Adam Hanson reviewed the Cares Grant and noticed that the grant should not be used for transportation, which led Adam Hanson, Business Manager, to follow up with the DOE and learned that buses cannot go into Capital Improvement dollars and still receive state reimbursement. One or two buses will be put back in the General Fund for FY 21.

The DOE had released information regarding CARES, but the federal government came back later with their own communication on how they define the Cares Grant. We need to wait for further clarification before allocating all of the CARES funds. Also, it is wise not to allocate all of the CARES Grant money now due to the expected financial needs of next year.

Katy Grondin shared about curtailment planning. There has been discussion about a possible curtailment after the July 1 state revenue dollars are assessed. The State subsidy dollars could be reduced, which would mean spending will need to be reduced.

Katy Grondin shared that they have been working on the retirement incentive for eligible teachers. Katy spoke to our attorney regarding possible furlough days for next year. Details are still being discussed.

City Council approved the FY 21 budget validation referendum question for July. They did not approve the second, non-binding question regarding voters' opinions on the budget. Katy Grondin and Karen Mathieu will not be moving forward with the second question.

Katy Grondin shared that they did not submit for the COPS grant but will potentially look to do so in future years.

Superintendent Grondin shared that the Lunch program has served 33,422 meals in the month of April. The 18 food service workers are working hard. They keep making adjustments to support the community. Melinda Chadbourne, a parent and social worker at Walton, has arranged for meals that are prepared and not picked up to be brought to a local food bank.

A. Planning and Development

1. FY 2020-21 School Calendar

Katy Grondin presented the School Calendar for 2020-21. This calendar is subject to change. The calendar shows 4 workshop days at the beginning of the school year, first day of school August 31 for K-9, September 1 for grades 10-12. The K-12 early release days are aligned with Lewiston schools. The workshop day in October is aligned state-wide with the technical centers. The school breaks are Thanksgiving, Winter, February and April. The last day of school for students would be June 8, and the last day for teachers would be June 9. The snow days would be replaced with remote learning days. The details have not been worked out yet. The School Calendar will be back on the agenda at the May 20th School Committee meeting for approval. Courtney Pierce, AEA President, and Maureen Edgerton shared survey results from educators about early release Wednesdays. There was a 30% return and of those who responded approximately 76% supported early release. They also shared why early release Wednesdays are important to teachers and how they use that time. School Committee members shared that they appreciated hearing from teachers and their input.

2. Spring Coaching Stipend

Katy Grondin, Superintendent, shared that after discussing with Todd Sampson, Athletic Director and researching Spring coaching positions, it was decided to pay a portion of the stipend at 33% for head coaches, 20% for JV, Freshmen and Middle School coaches.

School Board members indicated that they were in agreement.

B. Business

1. Auburn School Department's Emergency Operations Plan

The School Committee approved the Auburn School Department's Emergency Operations Plan.

3. Capital Improvement Project

Adam Hanson, Business Manager, and Billy Hunter, Director of Support Services presented the request of allocating up to \$50,000 of existing Capital Improvement funds to install a 10,000-gallon gasoline tank and related equipment at the Support Services building. Adam and Billy will look into whether it is possible to safely repair the existing diesel tank to extend its life and convert it to gasoline. If not, they will proceed with purchase of the new tank.

It was <u>moved</u> by Brian Belknap, <u>seconded</u> by Faith Fontaine and <u>voted</u> unanimously to approve the request to allocate up to \$50,000 of existing Capital Improvement funds to install a 10,000-gallon gasoline tank and related equipment at the Support Services building.

5. Retirement Incentive Program

Katy Grondin, Superintendent, presented the Retirement Incentive Program. Superintendent Grondin proposed that the School Committee authorize the Chair, Karen Mathieu, to sign the memorandum of agreement between the Auburn School Committee and the Auburn Education Association as presented.
