### Assessing

- The Municipal Valuation Return has been completed, proofed and returned to Maine Revenue Services ahead of the November 1st deadline. The statistics included in the report provide an overview of the municipals tax records as well as being used for computing reimbursements to the municipalities and providing data for the State Valuation Report. A copy of the MVR is included in the Commitment book.
- A full inspection of Fox Ridge Golf Course was done on Wednesday, October 12<sup>th</sup>. Each of the three golf courses have been inspected for the purpose of maintaining equity in the assessments of the 18 hole golf courses in Auburn.
- One in four inspections are continuing. If the weather cooperates the first round of inspections should be complete in approximately three weeks. Staff will be on target having completed exterior inspections on one quarter of the properties in the city.
- Building permits are issued by the Planning Department and put in a file to be reviewed and recorded in the Patriot CAMA system by the Assessing Department. All the permits issued from April 1 forward have now been loaded in our system.
- A survey of banking professionals, brokers and other appraisers has been done to gather information such as interest rates, equity yield, mortgage constants, required loan to value ratios etc. for use in deriving capitalization rates for both residential and commercial properties. This information will be useful when an Income Approach to Value is utilized to support assessed value.

- We continue to try to fill all positions at the polling places for the November election. We are still in need of Republicans to work the P.M. shift and Deputy Registrars who will register voters at the polls

## Fire

- > Crews responded to 5 fire calls in Auburn.
- > Staff performed several follow up inspections.
- > Staff met with the representatives from Tambrands to discuss their planned expansion.
- Crews continued Fire Prevention Week activities with Fire Drills in the schools and station visits from schools and preschools.
- > Crews performed 3 life safety inspections.
- > Staff attended the Auburn School's Functional Reunification Exercise.
- > Crews participated in training on advanced hose-line deployments.
- Crews attended hands on training in "confined Space Rescue" as part of our annual OSHA recertification requirements.
- Staff continued to work with other city departments on two buildings which are deemed to be unsafe for human habitation.
- For the week of October 6<sup>th</sup> to October 12<sup>th</sup>, we responded to 82 calls for service. These include, but are not limited to: 5 fire calls, 56 Emergency Medical calls, 3 Motor Vehicle Accidents 1 with injuries, 5 Hazardous Condition calls, 10 Service calls and 2 fire alarm calls. We received 1 mutual aid responses during this period and we provided 1 mutual aid responses. We provided 1 Paramedic intercept during this time period.

# IT

This week we began the process of updating the E911 addressing point file provided to us by the State of Maine. This is a GIS file that contains point locations for every address in the city. In the past, the emergency system used a GIS road centerline file, which provided approximate locations for addresses. This effort, required by Next Generation 911, will provide an exact location for every building in the city. The state has created the GIS file, using the Post Office database, but their locations are approximate. Over the next few months we will be re-locating all of the address points to reflect the actual building/address locations. This is a massive, time-consuming effort. (We are one of the first cities in Maine to go through this process.) The good news is that not only do we have a volunteer doing the work, but once complete, we will be able to use this data for a number of different applications, ranging from emergency operations to planning. - We have just completed an update of our GIS zoning map. The updates are currently under review by the Planning Department. Once approved, we will update the online maps to reflect any changes.
- GIS staff met with the City Engineer to review a new GIS dataset for our city-owned trees. We created an online map that provides several different views of the data as well as allows for staff to filter and explore the data based on their needs. The engineering department will be presenting the map to the Conservation Committee at their next meeting. We have not yet created a viewing application for the public.
- This week GFTV staff worked on some IT projects for city staff. Other activities included prep for Spring video course, Cleaning and maintenance of some equipment, updates to the community bulletin board and some file prep for programming.
- Staff will be meeting with representatives from Google to explore opportunities to upgrade our storage and office suites to cloud-based products.

### Police

- > The department handled 591 calls for service this week.
