AUBURN POLICE SHUT DOWN MARIJUANA DELIVERY SERVICE

AUBURN, ME – Auburn Police served a search warrant at 91 Minot Ave. apartment #2 on Tuesday evening. The warrant was obtained as part of an on-going investigation into suspected drug activity, including the manufacturing, sale and delivery of marijuana and marijuana concentrates in the Lewiston and Auburn area by 43-year-old Bruce Fournier.

Officers placed an order with Fournier through an online service, advertised as **B and B Delivery**. The order was for a specific quantity of "dabs" (hashish) with an agreed-upon price and delivery location. Upon taking delivery, officers served the search warrant at the apartment, a multi-family apartment building located within 1,000 feet of Edward Little High School and only 50 feet from the entrance to the "Snake Trail," a school-owned property and trail system that leads to Edward Little High School.

During the search the following contraband was seized:

- Over 20 pounds of processed marijuana
- 744 vials of hash oil
- 23 Xanax pills
- 62 Gabapentin pills
- Psilocybin mushrooms
- Manufacturing equipment for processing hash oil
- \$2,600 in suspected drug proceeds

Bruce Fournier was arrested and charged with Aggravated Trafficking of Marijuana-Class A; Unlawful Possession of Schedule (W) drugs-Class D; Criminal Conspiracy-Class D; and Violating Conditions of Release-Class E. Fournier is currently being held without bail at the Androscoggin County. This investigation is ongoing, and more charges are expected.
