LAW ENFORCEMENT – MORE THAN A JOB

AUBURN, ME – The Auburn Police Department is seeking full-time police officers.

The Auburn PD, a progressive, nationally-accredited law enforcement organization with 55 sworn officers and 8 civilian employees, has a proud tradition of honor, excellence, loyalty and professionalism.

“Law enforcement is more than a job,” said Chief of Police Jason Moen. “When you wear the badge, you become part of a tradition of service, pride and dedication – something much bigger than yourself. We are looking for individuals who truly want to have a positive impact on our community.”

Applicants must be high school graduates or have passed a high school equivalency exam, must be 21 years of age (or 20 with at least 60 college credits), and possess a valid driver’s license.

The testing process for police officers is rigorous. Applicants must pass the Maine Criminal Justice Academy’s physical agility test and ALERT exam. Lead candidates are also required to pass oral board, polygraph, medical, substance and psychological testing and an extensive background check.

“It is a challenging career field,” said Moen. “The schedule is demanding and includes nights, weekends and holidays. But it is also incredibly rewarding work. The camaraderie you have with your fellow officers; the challenges; and the opportunity to save lives every day – these are just a few of the reasons this is one of the best jobs out there.”

Starting salary and benefits are highly competitive. Graduates of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy (MCJA), Certified Police Officers and veterans are strongly encouraged to apply. Auburn has lateral entry and will recognize up to six years of full-time law enforcement experience in municipal, county, state or federal law enforcement.
