## ARREST MADE IN AUBURN SHOOTING

AUBURN, ME – On June 17, 2021, around 10:28pm, Auburn Police were called to the area of 43 Ninth St. for a reported domestic violence disturbance.

When officers arrived, they located the victim, a 47 y/o female who reported that her boyfriend, Germaine Page 42y/o of Auburn had shot at her with a gun during a domestic dispute. A physical altercation between the two had taken place, during the incident Page pointed a gun at the victim and fired a single shot. The shot missed the victim, and she was then able to flee from the apartment. Page fled on foot into the wood behind the apartment building.

The victim was not seriously injured. She was evaluated on scene by the Auburn Fire Department and transported to Central Maine Medical Center.

Several police officers and detectives conducted an area search for Page, but he was not located. Several hours later, around 2:40am, Auburn Police received a call from a neighbor familiar with Page. The neighbor reported that Page had returned to the area and was now hiding at 51 Ninth St. Page was located by police and taken into custody without incident.

Page was arrested by the Auburn Police Department and charged with the following crimes:

- 1. Criminal Attempt-Murder, class A felony.
- 2. Criminal Threatening with a Dangerous Weapon, class C felony.
- 3. Domestic Violence Assault, class D misdemeanor.

Page is being held without bail at the Androscoggin County Jail. This incident remains under investigation. No further information is being released at this time, including the identity of the victim.
