Auburn PD Brings Internationally-Acclaimed Speakers to Auburn

[Auburn, ME]: The Auburn Police Department looked at four years of crime data and found that twenty three percent of all crimes committed by youth offenders in Auburn took place within an area of less than half a square mile. Twenty five percent of all police calls for service and twenty eight percent of all youth victims were victimized in this same area.

In an effort to transform these statistics and provide positive and horizon-broadening experiences for at-risk youth in our city, the Auburn Police Department established the **Auburn Police Activities League (PAL).**

PAL encourages and develops leadership in youth and fosters communication, understanding, and mutual respect between youth, the community and police.
