

The tour requires walking on uneven terrain to 3 different stops. After our tour you are free to roam on your own and enjoy the grounds and the museum. The Maine Maritime Museum campus sits on 20-waterfront acres and includes 15 structures housing numerous exhibits and displays. We will meet back up at 2:30pm for our ride back to Auburn. Pack a lunch, there are picnic tables on the grounds. Pre-registration is required. Minimum 6/Maximum 14.
