  - a. Natural Products & Agriculture Working Groups Updates:
    - i. The latest Auburn watershed ordinance under reconsideration limits what types of Natural Products and Agriculture activities can take place in the watershed. Currently defined as limiting all "non hobby"agricultural activities, this would prohibit many benign types of activities such as maple syrup production, firewood sales and bee keeping just to name a very few. We have been asked as a group to offer suggestions and guidance to help redefine this ordinance and help promote agricultural and Natural product activities that would not be harmful to the watershed but of great benefit to property owners and our city.

The analysis would focus on optimizing costs and minimizing environmental impact.
