## BOARD/COMMITTEE/WG MEETING MINUTES

#### **Homelessness Committee**

Tuesday, October 21, 2025 Auburn Resource Center @ 121 Mill Street, ARC Conference Room, 9:30-11:00am

Meeting called to order at 9:30am

Tim Cowan reviewed agenda and facilitated introductions

Approval of minutes from 10/7/25

Motion: Bill, Second: George, All in favor

**Electing Secretary** 

Jen Eugley volunteered to serve as Secretary (needing coverage for absence 11/4)

Motion: Bill, Second: Dave, All in Favor

Discussion/Check-in about Committee's Purpose:

- Bill suggested adding language about advocacy from the region, Jeff recommended keeping the language broad
- Jeff added that things move/change rapidly, it would be helpful for this committee
  to not just think about big, longterm solutions, but also keeping up with current
  events/changes and be able to recommend action to the City in a timely fashion
  (Tim mentioned the example of the PIT Count coming up in late January)
- Jeff recommended setting up a folder on SharePoint for committee members' suggestions of community issues to address (ask Emily if that's possible)
- Dave gave the example of the Emergency Warming Center opening early (11/1 instead of 11/15)
- George: what if things happening in the community aren't known/represented by anyone on the committee?
  - Jeff suggested routing information through Tim
  - Committee members can provide updates as they get them on any of the things on our standing list of topics for the committee to cover

# BOARD/COMMITTEE/WG MEETING MINUTES

- Stephen: where can we find the most updated data about homelessness in the City? (where are the concentrated areas, like Bonney Park)
  - Tom said he can provide that information
  - Jeff: keep in mind that any data needs to be taken in context, and not to draw any hard conclusions from it
  - Stephen: can we put anything in place to collect better data? Are we any more confident in any of those data sources?
  - Tim: collect data from multiple sources, keeping in mind the limitations of each of those sets of data
- Tom recommended making sure we focus on Auburn
- Jeff: a lot of these topics could take a whole meeting to understand, but the committee should decide which items to focus on first
- Rebecca: how much of the committee's purpose is to recommend action steps to the City, how much is the committee deciding what they can do?
- Dawn: addressing the difficult ins and outs of regulations/criteria and how they're either not helping or even perpetuating homelessness
- Jeff: the committee won't be changing the rules of HMIS and other systems, but what changes can we advocate for to improve outcomes?
- George: prioritizing the list based on urgency and complexity; the committee should have a "subject matter expert" in each of the topics we cover; someone take each topic and present to the committee
- Bill: get information (summary, link to website, etc.) to read before the meeting about each topic we address
- Jeff: urgent topics Warming Center/Emergency Shelter (update to Lewiston tonight, recommend that everyone watches the livestream tonight)
  - Alter L/A Board is responsible for the Warming Center/Emergency Shelter
  - Starting Warming Center at Horton Street on 11/1/2025 up to 100 person occupancy, closing 1/3/2026 (funding for 8 weeks from Auburn/Lewiston City budgets)
  - 1/4/2026 open 40-bed Emergency Shelter (with \$2.5 million funding from MaineHousing)
  - Jeff has recommended just running the 100-bed Warming center from 11/1 until 4/1 and open the 40-bed shelter later

# BOARD/COMMITTEE/WG MEETING MINUTES

- Auburn City Council funds 40/60 split with Lewiston, we have the funds to fund Auburn's portion from 11/1 to 4/1
- First question: what is the committee's opinion on this plan and what funding the City should provide?
- Auburn could provide more funding to extend the Warming Center until 4/1, but Lewiston would have to meet that, as well
- Sasha: at Oxford Shelter in Portland, guests could move from overnight "shelter" (with mats to sleep) to a daytime warming center a block away
- Jeff: the City has a responsibility to provide a warming center throughout all of the coldest winter months
- Dave: the planning was always to operate the 40-bed shelter year-round, but add a 100-bed warming center during the winter months
- Committee's recommendation to the City: "Committee supports that we take efforts to maximize the number of homeless assisted at night, for their safety and the safety of Auburn."
  - Motion: Bill, Second: Dave, All in favor
- Nov. 3 and 17: Auburn City Council workshops at 5:30 on SSPs (syringe service providers) in light of the city's current moratorium on needle exchange – Jeff recommended that committee members watch
  - Tom: note that Spurwink is the only SSP in Lewiston currently
- o Jeff: talk about PIT next meeting
  - PIT numbers are important because Auburn has lost funding to address homelessness because we don't have the data to prove the need; Auburn is very invested in getting an accurate count
- o Jeff and Tim will consider also talking about needle exchange
- Presentation on student homelessness moved to next meeting

Motion to adjourn: Bill, Second: Dave, All in favor

Meeting adjourned at 11:00am
